







## Total known dead from Tiger Force atrocities: 81

Soldiers do not know how many people died in the bunkers, and several said they kept no count of what were widespread civilian deaths. Former medic Rion Causey said 120 were killed by his team during just one month. unit's night position. Sgt. Harold Trout fatally shoots the man.

July 27/ Song Ve Valley • Soldiers execute two prisoners on the order of an officer. July 28/ Song Ve Valley • The platoon opens fire on 10 elderly, unarmed farmers, killing four. Others are injured.

July 28/ Song Ve Valley • Soldiers stop a 12-year-old boy, Vo Tai Can, leading two unarmed, partially blind men. The boy is evacuated, but the soldiers execute the men.

## AUGUST

Early August/ Song Ve Valley • Lt. James Hawkins orders troops to fire on two unarmed, elderly women approaching camp. One woman is injured. log information was fabricated.

## UNKNOWN

**Unknown date/ Chu Lai** • Sgt. James Barnett executes a young mother on the order of Sgt. Harold Trout.

September to November/ unknown

**location** • Pvt. John Colligan shoots an unarmed, elderly Vietnamese man to test a present he had recieved — a 38-caliber handgun.

September to November/ near Tam Ky

• A soldier beheads one elderly man and medic Barry Bowman fatally shoots a wounded man in the same village.

\*The four Geneva Conventions of 1949 prohibit the inhumane treatment of noncombatants — defined as civilians, prisoners, and enemy soldiers injured in battle. Noncombatants cannot be executed or treated cruelly. The wounded must be medically treated. Prisoners must be evacuated from the war zone. And enemy corpses may not be mutilated.
